Justine Landau specializes in classical Persian literature and poetics. An alumna of the École Noramle Supérieure de Fontenay/Saint-Cloud, she holds an *Agrégation* in French Literature. She studied medieval French literature before moving on to Iranian Studies, at the INALCO and at the Sorbonne Nouvelle, in Paris, where she worked as a teaching assistant (2003-2007). Her PhD on early Persian literary theory entitled, "Aux origins de la poétique persane. Enjeux littéraires et linguistiques des traités de poétique persans du XIII^e siècle (VII^e siècle de l'Hégire)" [The Origins of Persian Poetics: A Literary and Linguistic Analysis of 7th/13th Century Persian Treatises on Poetics] is to be submitted in June 2012 at the Sorbonne Nouvelle (advisor: Professor Yann Richard). Justine Landau joined the Institute of Iranian Studies in Vienna in July 2010.
