Hussein Banai is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Diplomacy and World Affairs at Occidental College, and a Research Affiliate at the Center for International Studies at MIT. He earned his BA in Political Science at York University; his MSc in International Relations at the London School of Economics and Political Science; and his PhD in Political Science at Brown University. His research interests lie at the intersection of political theory and international relations with special focus on topics in democratic theory, liberalism, diplomatic history, and the history of political development in modern Iran. He is a co-author of *Becoming Enemies: US-Iran Relations and the Iran-Iraq War, 1980-1988*, and is currently working on a book manuscript on the history of liberal political thought in modern Iran.
